










Fact sheet Initiative "Every Roma child in Preschool"

The content of this publication is the responsibility of Observatory and does not necessarily reflect the views of UNICEF.






he Observatory for Children's Rights (Observatory), Women's Christian Association of Albania (YWCA), the Children's Human Rights Centre of Albania (CRCA), in partnership with UNICEF-Albania, are implementing the initiative "Every Roma Child in Pre-school Education", since October 2013. This project is supported by the Swiss Cooperation Office in Albania and the Austrian Development Cooperation.

Implementation of this initiative in each region and area of the country, among others, has succeeded to integrate many Roma children in kindergarten. Despite the challenges and difficulties faced, this third year has resulted in a total of **406** Roma children registered in kindergarten for the time period May – October 2016¹ from a total number of **1364** Roma children integrated in kindergarten, as a result of three academic years (Oct- Sep 2014, April – March 2015 and May- Oct 2016) or 29.7 %. According to Roma mapping, the total number of children aged 3-6 years old was **1451**, while the number of children aged 3-6 years old attending kindergarten was **383** or 26.4 % during the academic year 2011-2012²

Number of registered children in preschool 2011-2016³



During the third year of the initiative implementation are 375 children (of various ages) registered in compulsory education at the national level⁴, is doubled in comparison of children registered in the first year (74 children), and in the second year (311 children)

Number of registered children in compulsory education⁵



Other successes achieved by the implementation of this initiative are **96** Roma children vaccinated, for the period of project (May- Oct 2016)⁶. Are around **599** children vaccinated for the three year implementation project).

Number of vaccinated children⁷





During the implementation of the project we have identified children unregister in civil registry. This phenomena has been an obstacle for us, to integrate Roma children in kindergarten. In total 471 Roma children are identified as unregistered⁸. Referring to Roma mapping 389 children are identified as unregistered on civil registry.⁹

Number of identified unregistered Roma children¹⁰







Other successes achieved by the implementation of this initiative are **220** children registered on Civil Registration system. The number of Roma children registered in Civil Registry were (44 Roma children) in the first year, (148 Roma children) in the second year and 28 Roma children for the period of project implementation (May- Oct 2016)¹¹

Number of registered children in the civil registration office¹²



The whole process of inclusion of Roma children in kindergarten had a special attention to the community and parents. During this first year of project implementation, 9,639 parents of Roma community are periodically contacted and shared with them information about the importance of devoted attention and behavior with their children during their early childhood development. In comparison with the year I (2,162 parents), the number of contacted parents in year II (5863) is increased with 26.8 %. During this period of project implementation were contacted 1,614 persons of Roma community¹³

Number of persons contacted in the family¹⁴








The process of inclusion of Roma children in kindergarten had a special attention to the community and parents. During those years of project implementation, **149** Parental clubs of Roma and non Roma parent were established. We have realized periodically meetings with parent and shared with them information about the importance of early childhood development. During this period of project implementation were established 69 Parental clubs¹⁵

Number of Parental Club¹⁶





During the implementation of project "Every Roma child in preschool" many meeting and forum discussion were realized. The number of persons who have participate and trained from the meeting realized is 4,577¹⁷.

Number of persons trained by the project¹⁸




