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# Children, Adolescents and Youth-Focused Wellbeing Indicators

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## Introduction

This publication presents official statistics focusing on children, adolescents and youth in Albania. In comparison with the previous publication of year 2019, the total number of indicators has increased, to 104, providing a diverse overview of the various areas of rights and well-being of children, adolescents and youth.

The indicators have been processed based on data collected through surveys undertaken by INSTAT, as well as information management systems of state institutions (administrative data). Therefore, this publication would have been impossible without the close cooperation of state reporting institutions and INSTAT.

## This publication includes the following chapters, separated into different areas of focus.

Chapter 1 reports indicators from various fields, with comparative data for the period 2016–2019. Beyond the graphical presentation of the trends over the years, this chapter provides an explanation of the indicators and the relevant data sources. In the present edition, official statistics in the area of child protection are presented for the first time, including those for children in alternative care and adoption. Also, the indicators in the field of training and employment for young people are enriched and aligned with those set by Eurostat.

Chapter 2 maps all possible indicators with a focus on children, adolescents and youth within the Sustainable Development Goals. These data reflects the latest information, and new indicators are reported in comparison with the previous edition.


The appendix reports the absolute values of the indicators, including in some cases even more extensive data on specific indicators.


#### Sex ratio at birth



### Average life expectancy at birth (0-1 years of age) by gender




#### Abortion rate


## Abortion ratio per 1,000 live births of the respective population, by age group


#### Maternal mortality rate for 100,000 live births



### Gross enrollment ratio, by level of education





#### Net enrollment rate, by level of education






#### Percentage of repeaters, by level of education




## Proportion of youth who use the internet to communicate with public authorities, by gender


### Proportion of youth (18-24 years of age) school and training dropouts, by gender




## Young people 20-24 years of age, who have completed the upper cycle of secondary education, by gender



## Rate of children 0-17 years of age, victims of criminal offences, per 100,000 child population





## Percentage of children 0-17 years of age victims of criminal offences





## Rate of children (under 18) suspected of criminal offenses per 100,000 children, by age group








### Employment rate of youth (15-24 years of age), by gender and age group



### Youth 15-24 years of age not in employment, not in training or attending school, by gender





### Unemployment rate for youth 15-24 years of age, by gender





## Long-term unemployment rate of youth 15-24 years of age, by gender





## Unemployment ratio of youth 15-24 years of age, by gender






Youth 15-24 years of age self-employed, by gender

## Rate of children 0-17 years of age in alternative care at end of the year, per 100,000 children, by gender





## Rate of children 0-17 years of age in residential centres at end of the year, per 100,000 children






## Rate of children 0-17 years of age in foster families at end of the year, per 100,000 children
